MOST LIKELY YOU THINK OF SLAVE SHIPS FULL OF CAPTURED AFRICANS. YOU THINK OF THE AMERICAN SOUTH IN THE 1800S. AND YES, THAT IS A PICTURE OF SLAVERY. ONE PICTURE. BUT THERE'S ANOTHER ONE EVEN MORE SINISTER. SLAVERY HASN'T DISAPPEARED. IN FACT, EXPERTS HAVE CALCULATED THAT ROUGHLY 13 MILLION PEOPLE WERE CAPTURED AND SOLD AS SLAVES BETWEEN THE 15TH AND 19TH CENTURIES.

## ABOLISHING SLAVERY (CONT.)

Today, an estimated 40.3 million people — more than three times the figure during the transatlantic slave trade — are living in some form of modern slavery.

Ashley, Vice President for The Red Cord says, "Modern Slavery preys on two primal shortcomings of mankind: lust and greed. At the root of both of these is self-idolatry—the idea that you are the 'god' of your world, and others are worth sacrificing for your pleasure and comfort. With the rise of social media, the "mecentered" world has become mainstream. We not only became more passionate about glorifying ourselves, but we simultaneously degrade the existence of others by reducing them down to no more than a username and their "follow."

Predators/traffickers are well aware of this new socialization fact, and they are skillfully versed in how to exploit this for their gain. Instead of having to physically hunt down a victim (though this does still occur), all they have to do is "follow" them. Access to vulnerable populations has never been easier. Likewise, the void we feel due to unhealthy human connection is also creating new issues traffickers can use to reel in victims.

For the first time in history, unrealistic novelty in sex has been mainstreamed to millions of people on a daily basis. Slavery has many structures that support it including oversexualized media, new social norms promoted on social media platforms, hypersexualized children, etc. Supporting the modern-day slave trade does not always entail physically buying a person. Just as people in history supported slave structures by buying their products, we too are buying the products of slavers today.
