We think first, of course, of the **victims** themselves. Those who were looking for love and then seemingly found it in the attention given by a stranger met online, or by a trusted friend of the family, or even a family member. One action led to another until the victim is trapped in a darkness they cannot escape. But this darkness also affects **family members**. When families first learn that their child is a victim of trafficking, they may experience denial and confusion. Although there is no "typical" victim, they might still question how this could happen to their child. The entire family may have feelings of anger, sadness, guilt, shame, fear and even a sense of loss. The darkness engulfs the entire family. It may lead to questioning parenting abilities and self-blame or blaming spouses, or other family members for the circumstances.

The darkness and the spiritual battle don't stop there. It moves on to enshroud the **community** including churches, schools and law enforcement. Who is to blame? Who didn't see the warning signs? Which youth pastor, teacher or police officer should have taken the time to listen, see and intervene?

The answer is hard to see in the dark. It's hard to know how to fight an evil as dark as human trafficking. The challenge is to start sharing the light of Christ, one person, school and church at a time. Starting in your own home. Maybe even starting with yourself to seek help and realizing you aren't in this battle alone.
