

WHY IS THAT? A FEW OBVIOUS REASONS:

·WHEREVER THERE ARE CROWDS, LIKE AT PARADES, PARTIES AND AIRPORTS, THERE ARE INCREASED DANGERS AND MORE PREDATORS LURKING.
·WITH THE JOY OF THE SEASON, ALSO COMES STRESS. THIS STRESS MAY BE TAKEN OUT ON VULNERABLE CHILDREN IN VARIOUS FORMS OF ABUSE. WHEN FAMILIES UNRAVEL, OFTEN TRAFFICKERS ARE AWARE AND NEARBY.
·DURING THE HOLIDAYS, FACILITIES THAT PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO PEOPLE IN NEED, LIKE FOOD AND CLOTHING LOCATIONS AND EMERGENCY SHELTERS ARE OFTEN SHORT ON STAFF, HAVE DECREASED HOURS OR LOW ON RESOURCES.

GIFTS THAT KEEP ON GIVING

FORTUNATELY, 'TIS THE SEASON FOR GIVING! SUPPORTERS DIRECTLY HELPED TRAFFICKING VICTIMS IN SOUTHWEST OKLAHOMA. IN 2022, THE RED CORD PROVIDED RESOURCES TO SEVERAL VICTIMS FRESH OUT OF THE TRAFFICKING WORLD. THE CONNECTIONS WERE PROVIDED THROUGH LAW ENFORCEMENT. HERE ARE A FEW MORE WAYS YOUR GIFTS KEEP ON GIVING THIS SEASON AND YEAR-ROUND. YOU HELP:

 PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL MATERIAL FOR EDUCATORS, LAW ENFORCEMENT, AND SCHOOLS. EVERY YEAR, THE RED CORD PRINTS AN ABUNDANCE OF ITEMS INCLUDING TRAINING MATERIAL, EVENT SIGNAGE AND PROMOTIONAL PIECES. THE RED CORD ALSO PURCHASES MERCHANDISE USED FOR GIVE AWAYS AND FOR SALE INCLUDING CLOTHING, STICKERS, BRACELETS, ETC.

Support Oklahoma human trafficking shelters. Ashley Chapman, The Red Cord Vice President said, "The Red Cord is one of very few NGO's that support other vetted, credible service providers in our state. Since we understand the inestimable value trauma-informed care is for survivors, we reach out and assist the handful of shelters that meet those criteria."

- Assist survivors in need. Whenever a survivor reaches out with a practical need, The Red Cord wants to always assist in the form of buying food for the holidays, keeping their utilities on, or to provide diapers and formula for a month. This is not only a Biblical responsibility The Red Cord accepts, but a reasonable one as well. Psalm 82:3 says, "Defend the weak and the fatherless; uphold the cause of the poor and the oppressed." Ashley explained, "We NEVER want a survivor to feel that they have no one to turn to for help. Traffickers prey on this specific vulnerability, and we will not stand by as they do."
- Provide travel for training. The Red Cord trainers travel all over the state of Oklahoma to offer free trainings to anyone who asks. All trainers are volunteers and are unpaid board members. They use their personal vehicles to travel. Ashley said, "Whenever possible, we want to do our best to help our gracious volunteers with meals and gas expenses when they travel long distances for Red Cord events."
- Plan Community Events. Ashley said, "One of our greatest joys is to get out and interact with our community. Throughout the year, we hold multiple community-oriented events specifically designed to educate large portions of SW Oklahoma. By bringing our fellow Oklahomans together in unity for this cause, we are not only showing traffickers their days are numbered, but we are also telling victims they are not forgotten. There is hope!"


